

Luke 24:13-35



Narrator 1: Two of Jesus' followers were walking from Jerusalem to the town of Emmaus. It was the Sunday after Jesus' Death.



Cleopas: Why did Jesus have to die? Other Follower: He could have made our nation great again.

Narrator 2: Jesus joined them, but they didn't recognize him.

Jesus: What is wrong?

Cleopas: Don't you know what

happened in Jerusalem?

Other Follower: They crucified Jesus. We hoped that he would save us.

Friends: Jesus has been raised up! He appeared to Simon Peter.


Narrator 1: The two shared about meeting Jesus and how they knew him when he broke bread.
